

A walk on the banks of the Meschio

A pleasant itinerary in the countryside of Sacile

The Meschio, right tributary of the Livenza, is a resurgence river with a very regular character that rises in Vittorio Veneto, at Savassa, in a basin under the slopes of Col Visentin, in the Lapisina valley. Its stream winds for 25 km in the Sinistra Piave to end in Sacile, at Schiavoi, where it flows into the river Livenza. This is an area characterized by the mildness of the river and the rural landscapes, dotted with country caskets, witnesses to a feudal past and guardians of precious frescos.

Itinerary

The walk on the banks of the Meschio leads us into a very pleasant natural environment with a view on the river and its sounds; all around fields and vineyards. If we turn our eyes towards North, there are the mountains, to show themselves from the Cavallo to the Cansiglio. Along the route we go through the hamlet of Vistorta with its historical buildings and the site of the Tallon holiday camp, that in summer becomes also swimming and cool relief place.

We start from the car park in packed earth at the end of Don Milani Street immediately after the building of the elementary school.

- 1. We turn into the shady pedestrian lane that runs along the railway.
- 2. At the end, after 2-300 metres, we cross a grassy stretch on the right arriving at the entrance of the subway.
- 3. After the subway we walk down San Francesco Street for about 1 km, going through a small suburb and arriving at the crossroads with Strada di Topaligo (at the corner of the two roads we can see a capital).
- 4. We turn to the right and we arrive at the small church of San Daniele. A landscape leading to the left bank of the river Meschio opens on the adjacent bamboo grove.
- 5. We walk down the bank for about 1.8 Km and we run into a narrow-paved road that crosses the Meschio on a small iron bridge. We are in Vistorta and it is worth walking down towards the Church to see the scenery of ancient buildings of the suburb.
- 6. We go back to the small bridge and we go up the right bank of the river for others 1.2 Km passing by the Tallon holiday camp. In summer it may be pleasant and refreshing a rest on the gravelly banks.
- 7. We arrive at the bridge of Schiavoi where the walk on the bank ends and turning to the left we go down Bertolissi Street, high-traffic paved road, for about 300 metres.
- 8. On the left there is Boldarini Street, which leads again to the small church of Topaligo.
- 9. Going in the opposite direction of the outward route we come back to the car park in Don Milani Street.

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Information and Warnings

The itineraries indicated are easy to follow, they take place partly on dirt roads and, for the rest, along roads and cycle paths with as little motorized traffic as possible. It is therefore recommended, when starting the marked route, to comply with the rules contained in the Highway Code (Legislative Decree no. 285/1992 and subsequent amendments and additions) and to check any temporary limitations. For a pleasant excursion, in addition to choosing the trek according to your preferences, it is important to check the weather forecast and wear shoes suitable for dirt patches, such as light walking boots with sculpted sole, able to hold up even on muddy ground, wet grass, uphill and downhill gradients, and to adapt your clothing and visibility devices according to the route and light conditions. Any responsibility for the routes, if taken independently, is the responsibility of the individual trekker.
