## Walking along the Grava and the Rosta

The rural areas of Sacile embroidered by torrential streams

The torrent Grava, after having crossed the town of Caneva, flows into the river Livenza above the hospital of Sacile. Along its course the Grava receives the torrent Rosta, a short stream that rises in Caneva and winds through the countryside of Sacile among natural areas and rural suburbs.

### Itinerary

An easy walk without effort in the rural suburban areas rich in water that surround the north-west part of Sacile. We appreciate kitchen gardens and gardens, with the babbling of the water of the small brooks that cross the countryside before flowing into the Livenza.

- 1. We start from the hamlet San Michele, in Peruch Street, near the comfortable car parks of the homonymous Church and the nearby supermarket and we walk along the cycle-pedestrian path to the east for 2-300 meters, in the direction of the roundabout and San Michele Street.
- 2. Halfway down San Michele Street we meet a small bridge over the rivulet Rosta and turning left we go in Strada della Rosta, an asphalted narrow road that runs alongside the rivulet.
- 3. Continuing along the path for about 400 meters, at a second bridge over the Rosta, we pass a junction and take a pedestrian path that has on the left the grounds of the elementary school and on the right a riding school.
- 4. We arrive at the square in front of the school and take Gobetti Street going along it to the road to Caneva (Peruch Street) which we cross using the pedestrian crossing.
- 5. We go left until we enter Pestarole Street where after a hundred meters we find the entrance to the asphalted pedestrian track that leads to the waters of the Rio Grava in correspondence, on the other bank, of a bamboo grove.
- 6. We walk in a natural environment for 6-700 meters keeping on the left the peaceful flow of the Grava.
- 7. We get to the bottom up to a small bridge over the rivulet and at this point we come back repeating the pleasant walk along the Grava arriving at Peruch Street and at the starting point.

#### **Information and Warnings**

The itineraries indicated are easy to follow, they take place partly on dirt roads and, for the rest, along roads and cycle paths with as little motorized traffic as possible. It is therefore recommended, when starting the marked route, to comply with the rules contained in the Highway Code (Legislative Decree no. 285/1992 and subsequent amendments and additions) and to check any temporary limitations. For a pleasant excursion, in addition to choosing the trek according to your preferences, it is important to check the weather forecast and wear shoes suitable for dirt patches, such as light walking boots with sculpted sole, able to hold up even on muddy ground, wet grass, uphill and downhill gradients, and to adapt your clothing and visibility devices according to the route and light conditions. Any responsibility for the routes, if taken independently, is the responsibility of the individual trekker.
