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The Canevon and the "Walk of Sant'Antonio"

Rural environments, witnesses to ancient landscapes of wayfarers and pilgrims

This walk in the countryside of Sacile, besides being an approach to the Path Vita of Ronche, goes along again for a short stretch the Stage 6 "Sacile-Vittorio Veneto" of the devotional path of Sant'Antonio, which from Gemona del Friuli arrives at Padua. It is a path of faith in 11 stages, a route of over 250 kilometres that unveils fields and villages, art places and ancient suburbs.

Itinerary

This itinerary begins from a comfortable car park in Ronche and winds in the countryside of Sacile. It is although possible to reach this place starting from the centre of the city, crossing the main road SS 13 Pontebbana and walking on a cycle-pedestrian pavement.

- 1. At Sacile, from the Pontebbana, we get onto the road towards Sarone-Cansiglio. By car we drive along Ronche Street for 1 kilometre, just to the roundabout of Fazioli, the famous pianos manufacturing industry.
- 2. After leaving the car in the large car park on the right side of the roundabout, near the northern entrance to the Baden Powel Park, inside of which the Path Vita is located, we cross Ronche Street getting onto Canevon Street. We walk along the entrance to Fazioli company, where we can see the Concert Hall that plays host to music events at the international level.
- 3. After walking a stretch of around 500 metres among recently built houses, the road gets narrower and goes in the countryside, becoming one-way and flanked by small ditches. After a 90° curve we walk on to a crossroads, on the left side of which there is a capital, near the Manarin suburb. The view on the landscape is large and relaxing. North the view on the Pedemontana runs free from the Castelir of Stevenà to the castle of Caneva, to Sarone and the hill of San Martino, behind which it is possible to admire the profile of the mount Cavallo.
- 4. We turn to the right along Nanetti Street, going on for about 700 metres to come back to Ronche Street. The road is quite busy, but it can be followed for a short distance on the right, walking on a cycle-pedestrian path.
- 5. After around 300 metres we arrive to the church of Redentore in Ronche, built by Bertoja family and consecrated in 1913.
- 6. Having crossed the road at the zebra crossing, we get onto Noncello Street. After a short stretch inside of the recently built village, we arrive to the car park where we are ready to begin the Path Vita.

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Information and Warnings

The itineraries indicated are easy to follow, they take place partly on dirt roads and, for the rest, along roads and cycle paths with as little motorized traffic as possible. It is therefore recommended, when starting the marked route, to comply with the rules contained in the Highway Code (Legislative Decree no. 285/1992 and subsequent amendments and additions) and to check any temporary limitations. For a pleasant excursion, in addition to choosing the trek according to your preferences, it is important to check the weather forecast and wear shoes suitable for dirt patches, such as light walking boots with sculpted sole, able to hold up even on muddy ground, wet grass, uphill and downhill gradients, and to adapt your clothing and visibility devices according to the route and light conditions. Any responsibility for the routes, if taken independently, is the responsibility of the individual trekker.
